Foundation and Support.

The PLEASANT HILL ACADEMY was established as a permanent institution in the year 1884, by the American Missionary Association of New York City. The tuition fee paid by the students covers only a fraction of the actual cost of the advantages which it furnishes. The school is supported by the American Missionary Association.

Object.

The primary object of the school is the Christian education of children and youth, believing that in it alone rests the hope of our country.

PRIMARY GRADES.

INTERMEDIATE GRADES.

FIRST INTERMEDIATE.

Third Reader, Spelling, Numbers, Oral Lessons in Geography, Object Lessons, Drawing, Writing, Singing.

SECOND INTERMEDIATE.

Third Reader, Spelling, Elementary Arithmetic, Elementary Geography, Language Lessons, Object Lessons, Drawing, Writing, Singing.

GRAMMAR GRADES.

FIRST GRAMMAR.

Fourth Reader, Word Lessons, Elementary Arithmetic, completed, Elementary Geography, completed, Language Lessons, Object Lessons, Drawing, Writing, Singing.

SECOND GRAMMAR.

Fourth Reader, Word Lessons, Practical Arithmetic, completed, Geography, Graded Lessons in English, Oral Science, Drawing, Writing, Singing.

ELEMENTARY NORMAL GRADES.

FIRST ELEMENTARY NORMAL.

Fifth Reader and Newspaper, Word Lessons, Practical Arithmetic, Geography, completed, Graded Lessons in English, completed, Higher Lessons, History of United States, Oral Science, Composition, Drawing, Writing, Singing.

SECOND ELEMENTARY NORMAL.

Fifth and Sixth Readers, Word Lessons, Arithmetic, completed, Higher Lessons in English, Physical Geography, Morals and Manners, Oral Science, Colman's Alcohol and Hygiene, Composition, Drawing, Singing.

NORMAL GRADES.

FIRST NORMAL.

Literature, Elementary Algebra, Book-keeping, Higher Lessons in English, Composition, Geology of Tennessee, Physiology, Botany, Drawing, Singing.

SECOND NORMAL.

Literature, Geometry, Physics, General History, Government, Composition, School Economy and methods.

Buildings.

The new Academy Building, completed at the beginning of the year 1887, is ample for the present needs. It is furnished with patent folding seats and desks, and has ample blackboard room.

Boarding Hall.

A large three story building will soon be completed for the accomodation of students. Furnished rooms and board will be provided at the lowest possible rates.

Library.

Through the benevolence of friends of the school, in the North, we have a Library of over a hundred volumes, including Encyclopedias.

Religious Influences.

The influences of the school are decidedly Christian, though not sectarian. The study of the Bible is considered fundamental, and is therefore made a daily exercise.

Rules and Regulations.

It is very desirable that all students be present at the beginning of the school term, and continue till the close. If, however, this is not possible they will be received at any time.

The use of intoxicating liquors, tobacco and profanity is strictly forbidden, both in the buildings and upon the grounds. Every student by joining the school is regarded as giving a sacred promise to observe these and other regulations of the school.

It is desirable that each pupil bring with him a Bible, and, if possible, a dictionary.
