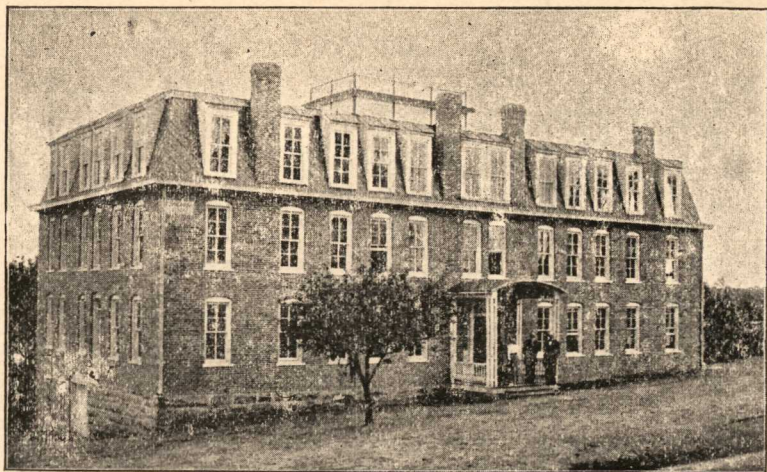
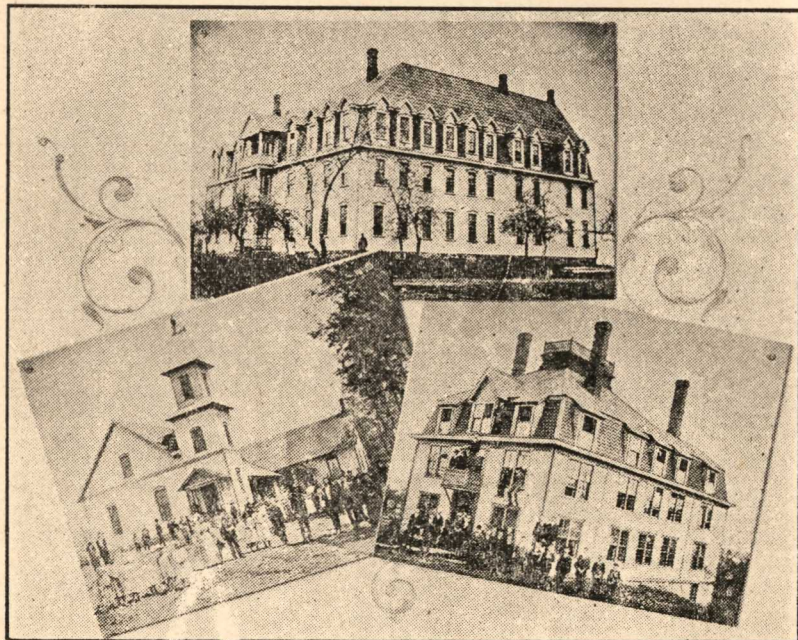

**SECOND GRADE.**—Third Reader and Supplementary Reading. Spelling. Elementary Arithmetic. Elementary Geography. Elementary Grammar. Drawing. Writing. Singing.

### COMMON ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

**FIRST GRADE.**—Fourth Reader and Supplementary Reading. Written Spelling. Elementary Arithmetic. Elementary Geography. Elementary Grammar and Composition. Drawing. Writing. Singing.

**SECOND GRADE.**—Fourth Reader and Supplementary Reading. Written Spelling. Practical Arithmetic. Geography. Elementary Grammar and Composition. Drawing. Writing. Singing.

**THIRD GRADE.**—Fifth Reader and Supplementary Reading. Written Spelling. Geography Completed. Practical Arithmetic. Grammar and Composition. History of the United States. Drawing. Writing. Singing.

**FOURTH GRADE.**—Reading. Written Spelling. Arithmetic Completed. Grammar Completed. Physiology. History of Tennessee. Morals and Manners. Composition. Drawing. Singing.

### NORMAL AND CLASSICAL.

**FIRST GRADE.**—Algebra. Physical Geography. Book-keeping. Gen. History. Rhetoric and Composition. Botany. Drawing. Singing.

**SECOND GRADE.**—Literature. Geometry. Physics. Government. Composition. Political Economy. Logic.

Latin is elective after Common English grade throughout the course.

**THE ACADEMY** is at Pleasant Hill, a slight elevation on the Cumberland Plateau, seventeen miles east of Sparta, on the old turnpike road between Nashville and Knoxville.

The school was established as a permanent institution in the year 1884, by The American Missionary Association, and is at present sustained by it.

There are at present four substantial buildings connected with the school.

The Academy building contains a large main room, a primary room, and three recitation rooms, also ample hat and cloak rooms.

Opposite stand two three-story dormitories, the rooms of which are completely furnished for the accommodation of the young men. Near by is the dormitory for the young ladies, which is spacious, and contains many well furnished rooms. In this building are the large, cheerful dining room and the rooms for the culinary department.

Too great emphasis can not be put upon the unsurpassed location of the Academy. It is a spot in which young people can study amid the healthful, educating and inspiring influences of nature, free from the distracting and demoralizing influences of towns, there being no saloon within a radius of seventeen miles.

The object of the school is the Christian education of its pupils and to furnish them with a thorough preparation for teaching according to advanced methods.

### MUSIC.

Facilities for instruction in both vocal and instrumental music are ample. The elements of vocal music are taught without extra charge. For practice in instrumental music there are three organs and two upright pianos.

### ADMISSION AND PROMOTION.

The only requirement for admission is a good moral character. All students will find classes suited to their needs. It is earnestly desired that, as far as possible, all the students shall be present at the opening of the school, and follow the regular course of study as laid down in the catalogue.



Upon the completion of the Common English Course, pupils will be entitled to certificates, and to diplomas on completion of the Normal and Classical Course.

The standard of excellence is one hundred per cent. A pupil cannot drop a study at the end of the time allotted to it, or be promoted in a study continued for a series of terms, unless he has attained an average of seventy-five per cent. The minimum average allowed in common school studies is seventy-five per cent. in completing a course.

This allows all who are reasonably faithful in their work to go forward in their studies, and secures that grading of classes, which is essential to any high standard of work in the classroom.

#### LIBRARY.

Through the benevolence of friends in the North, we have a library of over twelve hundred volumes, including encyclopedias. These are exerting a silent, but powerful educating influence, which more than repays the generous donors.

#### LITERARY AND SOCIAL ADVANTAGES.

All the teachers recognize the fact that their work and responsibilities are not confined to the school-room. They constantly exert themselves to make the school life pleasant and profitable.

The students and teachers support a literary and debating society, which during the past years has been well sustained, and its influence has been most beneficial to the young people.

#### RELIGIOUS PRIVILEGES.

The influences of the school are decidedly Christian, though not sectarian. The study of the Bible is considered fundamental, and is, therefore, made a regular exercise.

On Wednesday evening a weekly prayer-meeting is supported by the teachers and students. An active Society of Christian Endeavor, with which nearly all the scholars are connected, by its Sunday evening meeting, and its training in individual work, has been most helpful in promoting the Christian growth of the Academy.

#### REGULATIONS.

The government of the school is such as is needful for the good of all; and the ultimate end of all discipline is to aid in establishing habits of thoughtfulness, self-control, and courtesy. No student who is unwilling to meet these requirements, or who seems to lack appreciation of the benefits received, can expect to be retained.

Students are held responsible for any damage they may do Academic property. Students are required to attend the regular Sunday-school and church services on the Sabbath, and daily chapel exercises. Absence during the term will be allowed only to a limited amount. Terms open on Tuesday, to avoid the necessity of students coming in on Sunday.

No firearms, no use of intoxicating liquors or tobacco, in any form, and no profanity will be allowed in or about the school buildings or grounds.

Students desiring to work to meet expenses should correspond with the Principal before coming.

No work will be given students who persist in the use of tobacco.
