## Pleasant Hill Academy.

The Academy is at Pleasant Hill, on a slight elevation of the Cumberland Plateau, on the old turnpike road between Nashville and Knoxville.

### LOCATION,

### BUILDINGS AND

### OBJECTS.

Its location is 17 miles east of Sparta and about five miles south of Johnson Stand, a station on the Tennessee Central Railroad, and seven miles west of DeRossett on the N. C.

& St. L. Railroad.

The school was established as a permanent institution in the year 1884, by the American Missionary Association and is at present sustained by it.

There are five substantial buildings connected with the school. The Academy building contains a large Normal room, a Grammar room and three recitation rooms. The Primary Department occupies a commodious building by itself.

Opposite the campus stand two three-story dormitories, the rooms of which are completely furnished for the accommodation of the young men. Near by is the dormitory for the young ladies, which is spacious and contains many well furnished rooms. In this building are the large, cheerful dining room and kitchens.

Too great emphasis cannot be put upon the unsurpassed location of the Academy. It is a spot in which the young people can study amid the healthful, educating and inspiring influences of nature, free from the distracting and demoralizing influences of town, there being no saloon within a radius of 25 miles.

The object of the school is the Christian education of its pupils and to furnish them with a thorough preparation for teaching according to advanced methods.

Facilities for instruction in both vocal and instrumental music are ample. The elements of vocal music are taught without extra charge. For practice in instrumental music there are three organs and two upright pianos.

A chief requirement for admission is good moral character. Ap-

licants from other schools should furnish evidence of honorable dismissal. Credit will be given for the studies pursued elsewhere when proper credentials are shown; otherwise the usual entrance examination will be required.

All students will find classes suited to their needs. It is earnestly desired, that, as far as possible, all the students shall be present at the opening of the school, and follow the regular course of study as laid down in this catalogue.

Upon the completion of the Common English Course pupils will be entitled to certificates, and to diplomas on completion of the Normal and Classical Courses.

The standard of excellence is one hundred per cent.; seventy-five per cent. allows promotion. This allows all who are reasonably faithful in their work to go forward in their studies and secures that grading of classes, which is essential to any high standard of work in the class room.

Through the benevolence of friends in the North, we have a library of over six hundred volumes, including encyclopedias. These are exerting a silent, but powerful influence, which more than repays the generous donors.

All the teachers recognize the fact that their work and responsibilities are not confined to the school room.

**LIBRARY.** They constantly exert themselves to make student life pleasant and profitable.

**LITERARY AND SOCIAL ADVANTAGES.** The students and teachers support a literary and debating society, which during the past years has been well sustained, and its influence has been most beneficial to the young people.

The influences of the school are decidedly Christian, though not sectarian. The study of the Bible is considered fundamental, and is, therefore, made a regular exercise.

**RELIGIOUS PRIVILEGES.** On Wednesday evening a weekly prayer meeting is supported by the teachers and students. An active society of Christian Endeavor, with which nearly all scholars are connected, by its Sunday evening meeting, and its training in individual work, has been most helpful in promoting the Christian growth of the Academy.

The government of the school is such as is needful for the good of all; and the ultimate end of all discipline is to aid in establishing habits of thoughtfulness, self control and courtesy. No student who is unwilling to meet these requirements, or who seems to

lack appreciation of the benefits received, can expect to be retained.

Students are held responsible for any damage they may do Academic property. Students are required to attend the regular Sunday school and church services on the Sabbath and daily chapel exercises. Absence during the term will be allowed only to a limited extent. Terms open on Tuesday to avoid the necessity of students coming in on Sunday.

No fire arms, no use of intoxicating liquors or tobacco in any form, and no profanity will be allowed in or about the school buildings or grounds.

Students desiring to work to meet expenses should correspond with the Principal before coming.

No work will be given students who persist in the use of tobacco.

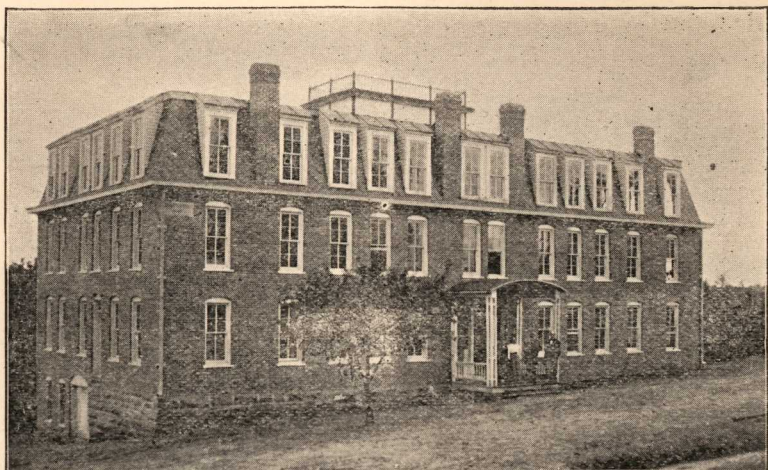
**Sewing.**
