As we travel back to New York, we pick up the latest newspaper and what do you think the headlines are?

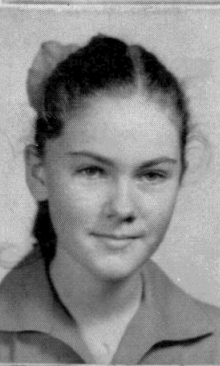
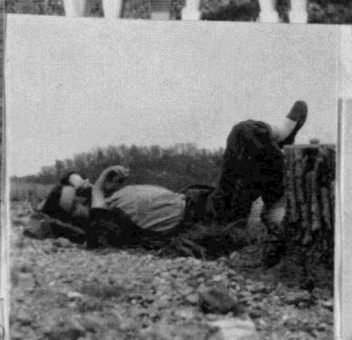
MAN HAS LANDED ON MOON! We read further and find that the man is Morris Smith and the famous scientist who built this marvelous rocket is Charles Pickett.

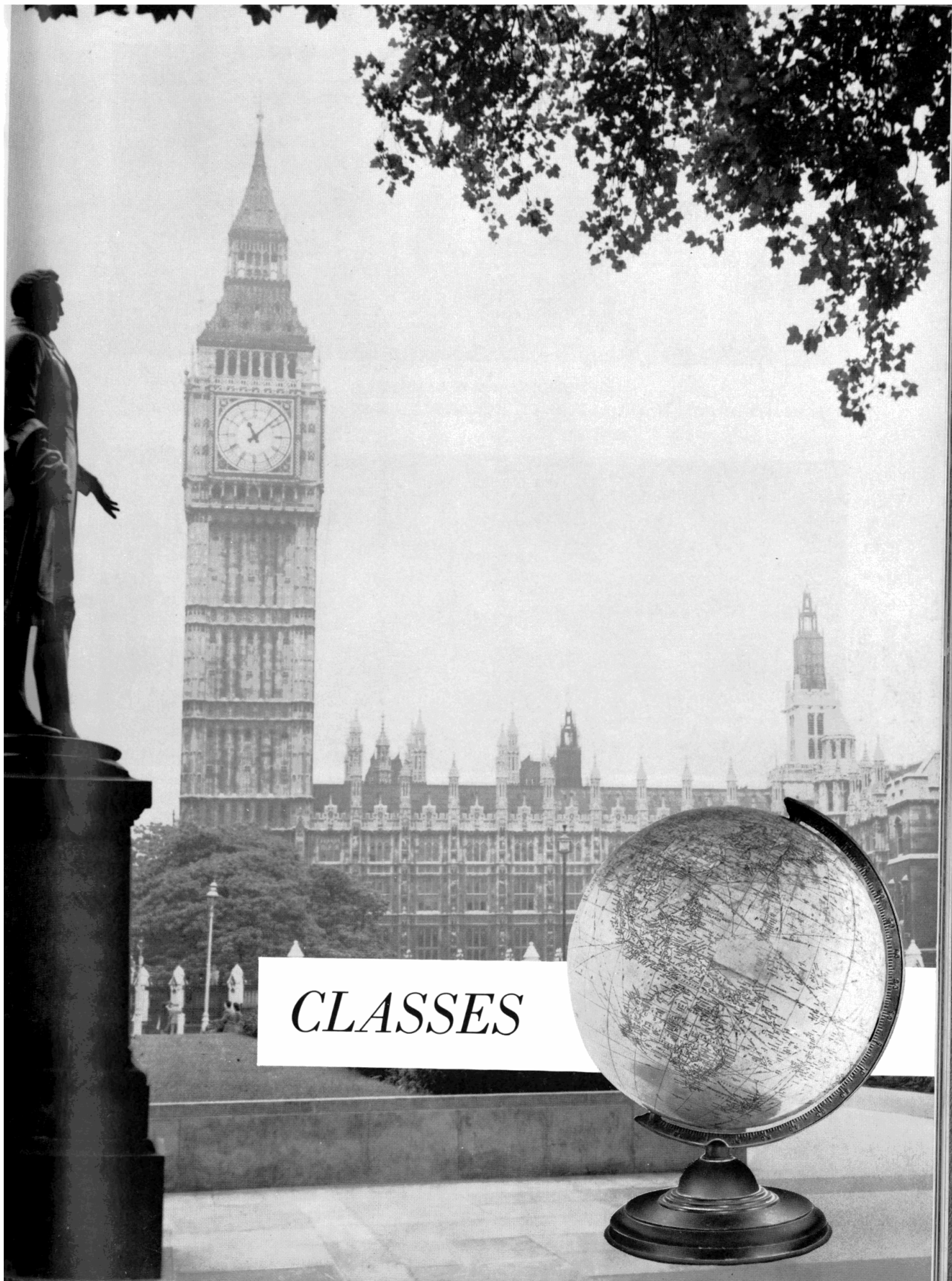
When we depart in New York we make plans to tour Canada soon, where we expect to see Winston Steelman who is now a Royal Canadian Mounted Policeman.
