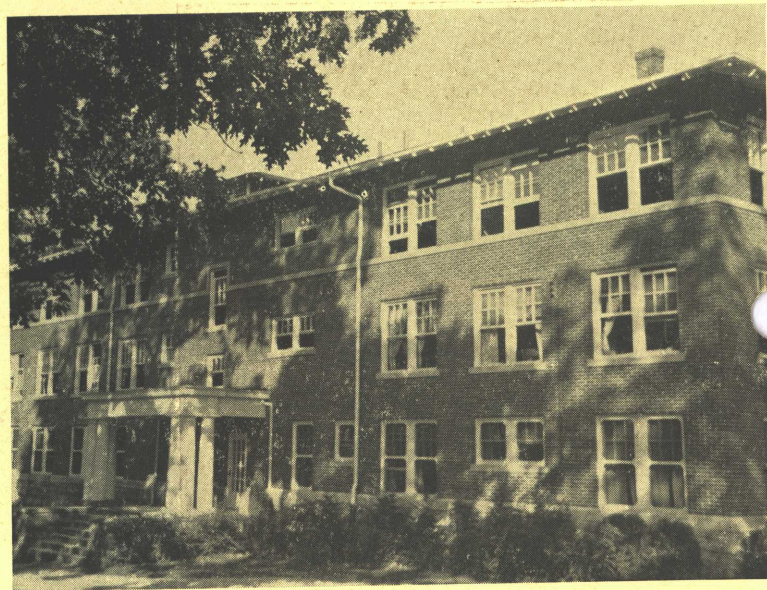

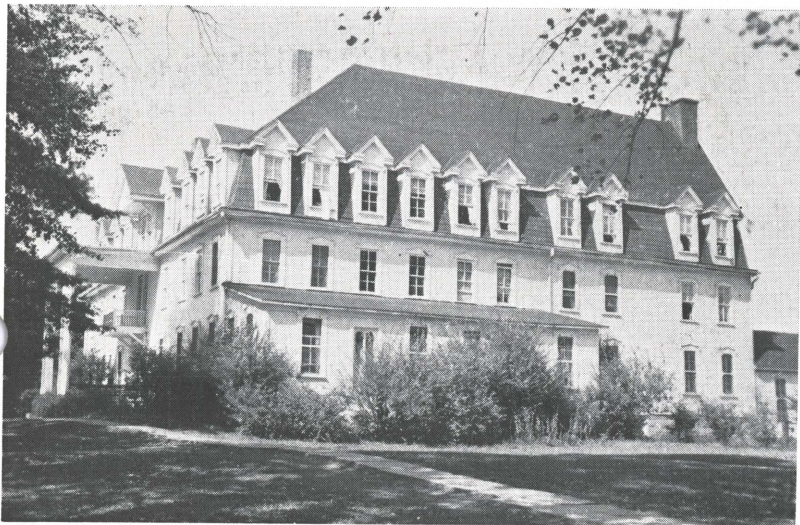


Educational opportunities are made available to those who might not otherwise have them.

These sisters—like all other students have become skilled in the many phases of Pleasant Hill's activities.



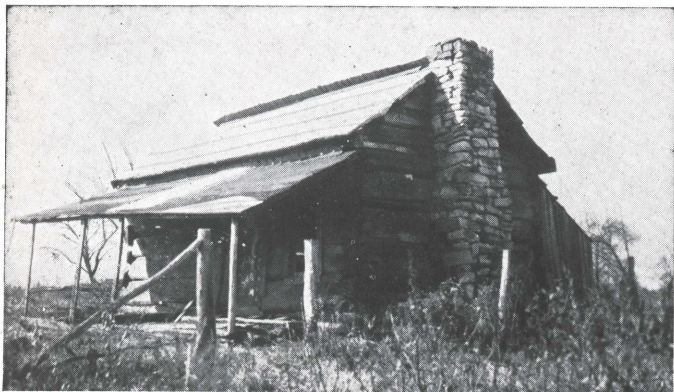
Carvers Convention

Discovering and encouraging talent is a useful service. Carving and other handicrafts may create self respect, confidence, economic benefit and a valuable hobby.



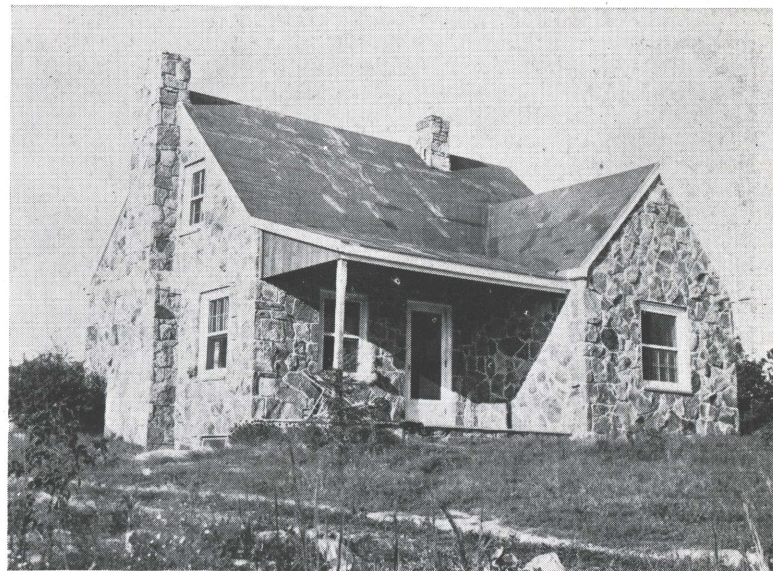
"Art On Our Campus"

Setting for a student assembly program showing how art is useful in many common experiences.

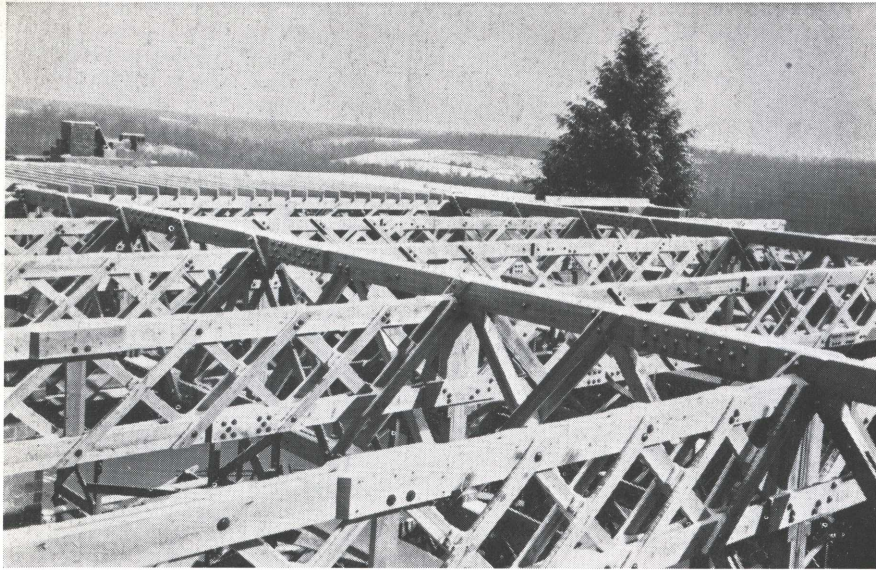


Typical of countless mountain cabins

on our own land.**



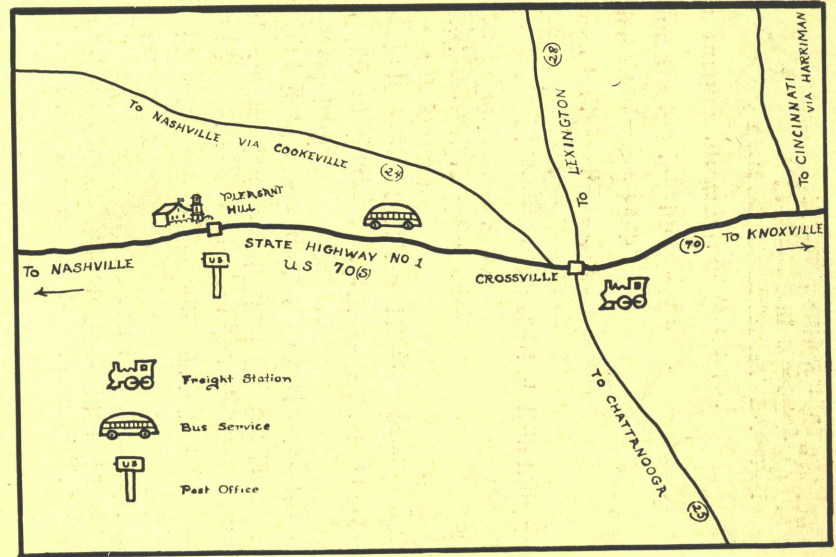
Practical Home Nursing
