CONCERNING THE FOLK TEAMS OF PLEASANT HILL ACADEMY

This little illustrated booklet tells the story of an experiment. The Ballads, Singing Games and Folk Dances of the mountains are an integral part of mountain life and represent a distinctive feature of American culture. At Pleasant Hill Academy, a mountain school conducted by the Home Boards of the Congregational-Christian Churches, there is a determination to conserve and extend the value of these features of mountain life. For that reason the songs, games and dances constitute an important part of the life of this school.

Whenever guests came to visit us they were, whenever possible, invited to share in an evening of such recreation. This seemed to elicit enthusiastic response along with the mountain handicrafts program, the community agricultural activities and the educational experiments in identifying the school with the needs of the area. Because of this interest it was thought by the school staff that a double purpose might be served by our taking these songs, games and dances to other parts of the country. We believed we might encourage elsewhere also an interest in this wholesome, democratic form of recreation, provide a delightful evening of invigorating enjoyment for the entire constituency of churches or other groups and at the same time present a first hand and fresh view of Pleasant Hill Academy.

At first it was difficult to secure appointments. However, once a church invited a Pleasant Hill team there almost invariably followed an invitation to return the following year. The accompanying pages reveal some churches inviting the teams for all four of the years our teams have been touring. Frequently it has been impossible to accept invitations for succeeding seasons because itineraries did not permit it.

As will be noticed many of the engagements are for church services. These involved the telling of the story of the settling of the mountains and the basis for the strong interest in certain aspects of the Bible and religion. This story of the development of the Highlands was paralleled with a presentation by the team of old and modern sacred music characteristic of the region.

One of the first of the self-help schools in the mountains, Pleasant Hill Academy has been pioneering in religion and education for more than sixty years. It has always been a conviction of those responsible for this school that religion affects every phase of life. There is no point of separation. Hence, the emphasis on clean, wholesome recreation as an indispensable part of the life here.

Accompanying this note of explanation is an expression of very warm thanks to the churches and other organizations which have invited us to share an occasion with them. Also, are we grateful to the hundreds of hosts who have entertained the members of the teams in their homes.


