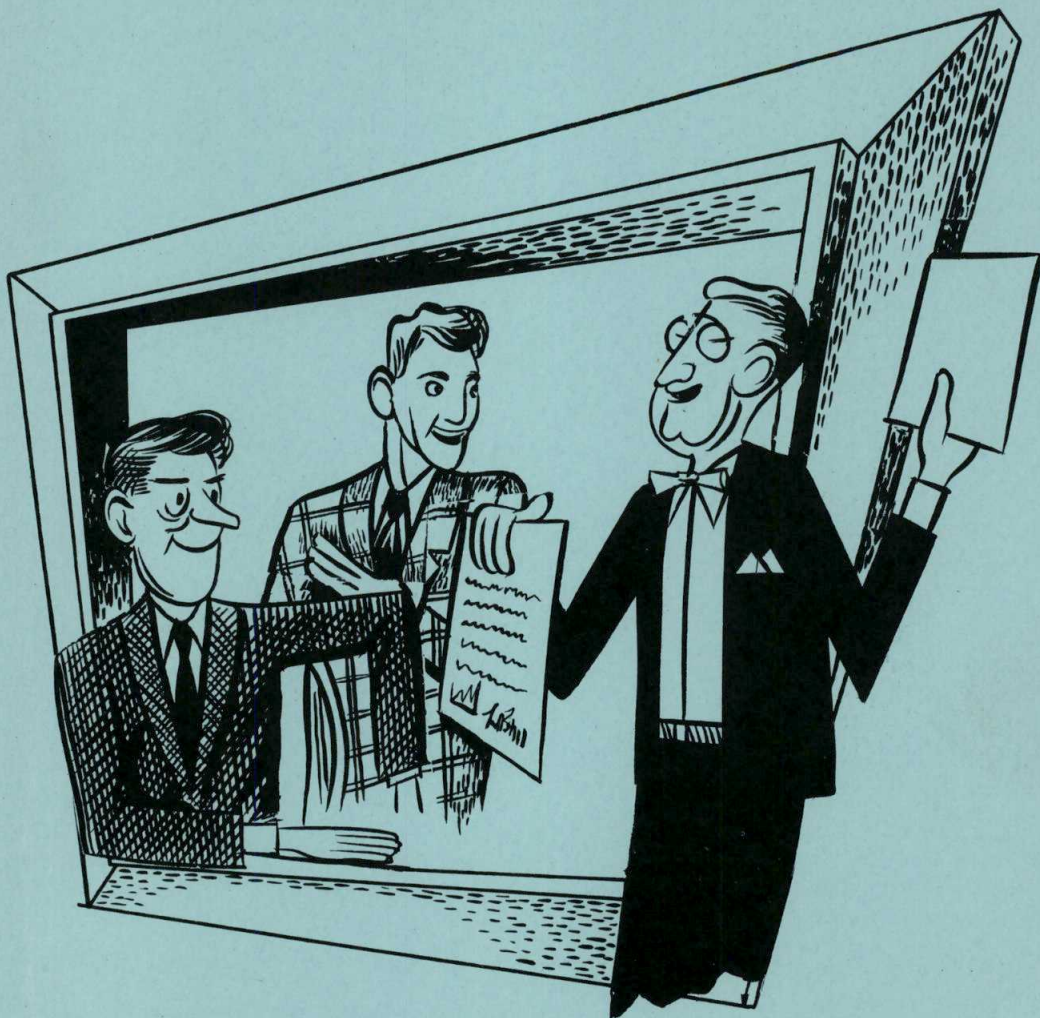


Dedication
