Class History

After a week of empty stomachs in history class, we went back to the lunch room.

During that year we found we possessed a variety of talent. The most outstanding being our ability to write. Our Home Economic girls wrote an original story of our adventures in that class. They let the students and faculty see our brilliance as homemakers---much to our embarrassment.

As time marched on, we found we were nearing the half-way mark between here and there. Our jolly jounior year started the last half of our trip. To make the year jollier we added to our class roll Marylyn Baker, Bonnie Kate Davis, and Monroe Thompson. That year we were really popular with all the classes and the faculty. The seniors were nice to us because they were afraid if they were not, we would not give them a nice banquet. The sopomores were "pals" because they thought if they did not, they might not get to help with the banquet. The freshmen honored us because---well, for the same reason we honored juniors when we were freshmen---they just did not know any better. The faculty likes everybody, even us juniors.

Our class was on top as leaders of sports at the first of the year. Wilma Jean was captain of the girls' basketball team and Betty Lou, captain of the Cheering section. Our record was broken when we lost Charles Bradbury, captain of the boys' basketball team. At that time we also lost David Daugherty and later, Junior Seegraves. Both were ball players.

We got right away with preparation for the Junior-Senior Banquet. A Halloween Carnival helped to furnish money needed to give the seniors what we planned. On April 24, with decorations, lovely music, Mr. Parker's voice, and our imagination, we were carried away to the Hawaiian Islands for our semi-formal banquet.

Suddenly we find we are going down the very last lap of our journey. Our group has grown still smaller. One of those Yankees came and took away our little hillbilly Phyllis. Pat Bearden heard wedding bells, but she is still preparing for graduation while her husband, Charles Bradbury, and already a successful cook in the Army. Julia also found happiness elsewhere. Amos Wightman, who stepped out of school a year or two ago, came back to finish with us. There will be only a small group of us to receive our reward at the finish line.

As we come nearer the end, we think back and wonder where these four years have gone so fast. After we have left Dear Ole' Pleasant Hill, we will have many memories of our Alma Mater stored away in our book of memories to carry with us all through life.
